On Feb. 19, 1942, President Franklin Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066, which led to the incarceration of 120,000 Japanese Americans during WWII. Each year, Mile High JACL hosts a Day of Remembrance event to mark that dark chapter of US history. On Sunday Feb. 19 from 1-3 pm at History Colorado Center, join us for keynote speaker Satsuki Ina, who will pay tribute to the Women of the Japanese American Experience. History Colorado will also host a special weekend-long popup exhibit of artifacts, "Contested Histories," from the Japanese American National Museum in Los Angeles, and a screening of two films on Saturday, Feb. 16.
